Women leaders have much to celebrate and, at the same time, many challenges to face. IWF members must protect progress, redouble efforts after setbacks, and remember that we have the power and influence to make a difference.



New Forum Launches

IWF has expanded its global presence to 35 countries across six continents. The 2025 launch celebrations for IWF Korea and IWF Peru were powerful gatherings of leaders who share vision, values, and purpose – and wonderful opportunities to build connections among regional leadership.

IWF Korea held its official launch event in June. IWF Global Board Chair Kimberly Cooper Jaqua, past IWF Global Board President Helen Rule, and other global leaders joined Forum presidents from across the Pacific Rim, new members, distinguished guests, and next-generation Korean leaders in Seoul to celebrate the launch.

The new Forum's leadership and members have quickly embraced our mission and values, holding convenings and traveling to regional and global events.



With 60 founding members, **IWF Peru** became the seventh Forum in Latin America. A celebratory launch event was held in March when IWF Global Board Chair Kimberly Cooper Jaqua, past IWF Global Board President Teresa Weintraub, and IWF leaders welcomed IWF Peru to the global community.

The event also marked the first-ever gathering of Forum presidents from across the region.



CLASS OF 2024-2025

A Milestone Year

The 2024-2025 Leadership Fellows class was the largest cohort ever, with 46 exceptional women from eight countries: Australia, the Bahamas, Canada, India, Mexico, South Africa, the United States, and, for the first time, Armenia and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands. This class also includes our first participant who identifies as having a disability.

The class began its journey with the Program's 30th anniversary celebration at the Library of Congress in Washington, D.C. Alumnae and IWF members whose vision and action created and nurtured the program came together to reflect on its important contribution to IWF's mission. After customized instruction at INSEAD and Harvard Business School, the program concluded with a graduation ceremony at the Harvard President's house.

During the graduation celebration, the class announced the establishment of a Leadership Fellows Legacy Fund to support a Fellow in the 2025-2026 class.

Local Leadership Development Programs

Around the world, Forums have created leadership development programs to meet the needs of rising women leaders.

IWF AUSTRALIA

IWF Australia's structured six-session "Emerging Women Leaders" program guides participants on a leadership journey through the personal stories of established leaders within the IWFA network. Over 300 women leaders have completed the EWLP program since its inception in 2019.



IWF JORDAN

IWF Jordan's Leadership Enhancement and Mentoring Program (LEMP) empowers rising women leaders to develop essential leadership skills for success in their chosen careers.



IWF SINGAPORE

The IWF Singapore Education Grant, managed by the Community Foundation of Singapore, supports young women from financially challenged backgrounds. On November 8, 33 recipients received the EduGrant award, and since 2014, 253 grants have been awarded across 13 local institutions.

IWF SOUTH AFRICA

The IWFSA Fasset Women's Leadership Program, led by the Finance and Accounting Services Sector Education and Training Authority (FASSET) and IWF South Africa, aims to develop 1,000 women leaders in finance through mentoring and skills training.



IWF SPAIN

IWF Spain collaborates with EY to promote women's leadership through individual mentoring and roundtable discussions on key topics through the Aprende con #EYas program.

WE CELEBRATE.

Honorees recognized through our awards programs — the International Hall of Fame, Women Who Make a Difference, Leading Light, and Ideas Remaking the World — lead change globally and locally and show the world the art of the possible. Our local Forums' signature events showcase both the power of individual honorees and IWF Forums.





International Hall of Fame

Since 1985, the IWF Hall of Fame awards have been the most important annual event for IWF, honoring women taking on the most urgent issues facing the world. Awardees are transformative leaders whose contributions to society are outsized on a global scale. This award is bestowed each year in recognition of their remarkable impact.

2025 IWF Hall of Fame Honoree

DR. PRECIOUS MOLOI-MOTSEPE

Co-Founder and CEO, Motsepe Foundation | IWF South Africa

At the World Leadership Conference in Seattle, Washington, IWF inducted Dr. Precious Moloi-Motsepe into the International Hall of Fame. Dr. Moloi-Motsepe is one of the most influential leaders in Africa. She is a physician, businesswoman, philanthropist, trailblazer, and visionary.

Along with her husband Patrice, she founded the Motsepe Foundation, one of the largest philanthropic entities on the African continent. The initiatives of the Motsepe Foundation are associated with 12 of the 17 UN Sustainable Development Goals including: education, community development, sports, and social cohesion. The Foundation's reach is global, supporting the Milken-Motsepe Innovation Prize with \$6 million to date. Precious founded Africa Fashion International and was recognized by the Business of Fashion for her role in catalyzing inclusion and the growth of African voices in the fashion industry, Credit Suisse named her a Woman of Impact.

Her passion and steadfast commitment to advancing equal opportunity have transformed communities and created pathways for the next generation of women leaders and changemakers.

CONFRONTING CHAOS AROUND WOMEN'S LEADERSHIP

INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S FORUM

TO SUPPORT YOUR MESSAGING THE LATEST FACTS AND FIGURES

The UN Women's Gender Snapshot highlights that failing to invest in gender equality costs the global economy trillions of dollars annually, with projections that closing these gaps could add up to \$20 trillion by 2025.

The World Economic Forum's Global Gender Gap Report 2025 estimates that, at the current pace, it will take 123 years to close the global gender gap across economic, educational, health, and political dimensions.

This report also found:

- The global gender gap score in 2025 for all 148 economies included in this edition of the Index stands at 65.8% closed.
- No economy has yet achieved full gender parity. Iceland (92.6%) continues to lead the Global Gender Gap Index, holding the top position for 16 consecutive years, and remains the only economy to have closed more than 90% of its gender gap since 2022.
- Women's workforce participation globally has risen to 41.2% in 2024, with notable gains in traditionally male-dominated sectors such as infrastructure (+8.9 percentage points).
- Between 2015 and 2024, the share of women in top management rose from 25.7% to 30.1%, but progress has slowed post-2022. In many sectors, top-level gains are outpacing mid-level promotions, risking the sustainability of balanced talent pipelines.


